Award Description

The award will be given for the best overall research. For purposes of this award, "research" broadly includes all forms of empirical psychology, such as experiments, correlational studies, historical studies, case histories, and evaluation studies.

This award honors Albert Bandura, a Distinguished Member of Psi Chi and a William James Fellow of the Association for Psychological Science (APS) for significant lifetime contributions to psychology. Dr. Bandura has been an exemplary and dedicated supporter and mentor of students and their research throughout his long professional career. The award is presented during the opening ceremony at the annual APS National Convention.

The winner receives the following:

1. up to \$1,000 for travel expenses to attend the APS National Convention to receive the award,
2. a three-year membership in APS, including subscriptions to all APS journals, and
3. two engraved plaques, one for the winner and one for the winner's psychology department, as a permanent honor to the winner.

Eligibility

The submitter of a research paper must meet the criteria listed below.

1. Must be a Psi Chi member and an APS graduate student affiliate at the time of submission.
2. Must be a graduate student at the time the research was carried out and the paper submitted for presentation.
3. Must be the primary and first author.
4. Must have published and/or presented the paper at a national, regional, or state psychology convention between November 1 of the previous academic year and October 31 of the current academic year.
5. The winner is not eligible to receive the Bandura Award and the Psi

Chi/APA Edwin B. Newman Graduate Research Award in the same year.

Style/Standards

1. An electronic document which conforms strictly to the instructions in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (APA).
2. The text of the paper is limited to a maximum of 12 pages (double-spaced) in 12-point font. In addition to the 12 pages of text, the paper should include a title page, 120-word abstract, references, and any tables, figures, or notes that are necessary.
3. All papers receive masked review. The manuscript should include a separate title page with authors' names and affiliations, and these should not appear anywhere else on the manuscript. Footnotes that identify the authors should be on a separate page. **Authors should ensure that the manuscript itself contains no clue to their identity.**

Submission Procedures

1. Submit online at www.psichi.org under the AWARDS/GRANTS section. The link for submissions is available at least one month prior to the submission deadline.
2. Submissions are accepted until midnight local time on February 1. Late entries cannot be accepted.
3. Submit researcher information contained on the submission form to the right.
4. Submit one copy of the research paper.

Winner Responsibilities

The winner will provide the Psi Chi Central Office with the following for publication in *Eye on Psi Chi*.

- A 120-word abstract
- A 150-word biography (third person)
- A digital photo (600KB file size)

These items need to be emailed to awards@psichi.org by March 15 of the winning year.

All proposals must be written in English.
