Award Description

Students are invited to submit poster proposals for presentation during the 2010 Psi Chi Program held during the 22nd Annual Convention of the Association for Psychological Science (APS). Psi Chi has reserved a special portion of the Psi Chi program for this Psi Chi Student Poster Session. The student proposals must be entered online at www.psichi.org.

Psi Chi will present four undergraduate student awards of \$300 each and four graduate student awards of \$500 each to the Psi Chi members submitting the best research to this Psi Chi Poster Session.

Eligibility

1. The first author of each proposal must be a student.
2. Only submissions with a first author who is a Psi Chi member are eligible for the eight cash awards presented for the best research submissions.
3. Each proposal must include the signature of an APS member in an act of sponsorship.
4. An individual can be first author on only one poster proposal.
5. Proposals submitted for possible presentation at other professional meetings are not acceptable for the 2010 APS Convention. If you submit a proposal for the regular APS poster session, do not submit the same proposal for the Psi Chi poster session.

Style/Standards

1. An electronic document which conforms strictly to the instructions in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (APA).
2. The text of the submission should be in 12-point font (double-spaced).
3. Poor spelling and grammar will penalize otherwise sound submissions. Faculty sponsors are encouraged to review submissions prior to entry.
4. To allow for anonymous review, the names and schools of the submitters and any other identifying information should appear only on the proposal cover sheet. Proposals that do not adhere to this guideline will not be accepted.

Submission Procedures

1. Submit one copy of the Psi Chi/APS Poster Cover Sheet (back), one copy of a 50-word abstract, and a 400- to 500-word summary of the proposed presentation online at www.psichi.org under the AWARDS/GRANTS section. The link for submissions is available at least one month prior to the submission deadline.
2. Submissions are accepted online until midnight local time on December 1. Late submissions cannot be accepted.
3. Both the abstract and the summary should include a brief background of the research; its purpose, hypotheses, design and method, and statistical tests and their results; and a brief discussion of the implications of the results. Only research that has been completed by the time of proposal submission will be considered for review.
4. The title must not exceed 12 words.
5. Try to limit the number of authors to less than four. List the names and school affiliations of each author.
6. The first author must register for the convention and pay the APS registration fee in order to present the poster. Other authors who attend must also register for the convention. Psi Chi members may register at APS Student affiliate rates by showing Psi Chi membership cards. Psi Chi student fees will be approximately \$85 for advance registration (based on last year's fees). APS convention registration forms will be mailed to those students whose posters are accepted by Psi Chi.

Winner Responsibilities

Each award winner is responsible for presenting his or her poster at APS. Each winner will receive his or her award check and a certificate at the APS convention.

Award Description

Students are invited to submit paper and poster proposals for presentation at the 2010 Psi Chi Society Annual Convention, held in conjunction with the 118th Annual Convention of the American Psychological Association (APA). Psi Chi has reserved a special portion of the Psi Chi program for these Psi Chi Student Paper and Poster Sessions. The student proposals must be entered online at www.psichi.org.

Psi Chi will present four undergraduate student awards of \$300 each and four graduate student awards of \$500 each to the Psi Chi members submitting the best research to these Psi Chi Paper/Poster Sessions.

Eligibility

1. The first author of each proposal must be a student.
2. Only submissions with a first author who is a Psi Chi member are eligible for the eight cash awards presented for the best research submissions.
3. An individual may be first author on only one Psi Chi paper or poster proposal.

2. Participants should adhere to the APA Ethical Principles and Code of Conduct in their research and their presentations. See the APA's *Publication Manual* for specific suggestions with regard to reducing language bias.
3. The text of the submission should be in 12-point font (double-spaced).
4. Poor spelling and grammar will penalize otherwise sound submissions. Faculty sponsors are encouraged to review submissions prior to entry.
5. To allow for anonymous review of the proposals, the names and schools of the submitters and any other identifying information should appear only on the proposal cover sheet. Proposals that do not adhere to this guideline will not be accepted.

Submission Procedures

1. Submit one copy of the Psi Chi/APA Paper & Poster Cover Sheet (on back) and one copy of a 400- to 500-word summary of the proposed presentation online at www.psichi.org under the AWARDS/GRANTS section. The link for submissions is available at least one month prior to the submission deadline.
2. Submissions are accepted online until midnight local time on December 1. Late submissions cannot be accepted.
3. The text of the summary should not be less than 400 words and should include a statement of the problem, subjects used, procedure, results, and conclusions. Only research that has been completed by the time of proposal submission will be considered for review.
4. The title must not exceed 10 words.
5. Try to limit the number of authors to less than four. List the names and affiliations of each author.
6. The first author must register for the convention and present the paper or poster.

Winner Responsibilities

Each award winner is responsible for presenting his or her poster at APA. Each winner will receive his or her award check and a certificate at the APA convention.
