## PURPOSE

To award the best overall research



## ELIGIBILITY

The submitter of a research paper:

- is not required to be a Psi Chi member,
- must be a graduate student at the time the research was carried out and submitted for publication and/or presentation,
- must be the primary and first author, and
- must have published and/or presented the paper at a national, regional, or state psychology convention between January 1 and December 31 of the previous calendar year.

Winners are not eligible to receive the Newman Award and the Psi Chi/APS Albert Bandura Graduate Research Award in the same year.



## STYLE / STANDARDS

1. Papers must be an electronic document written in English conforming strictly to the instructions in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (APA).
2. The text of the paper is limited to 12 pages in 12-point font (double-spaced). In addition to the 12 pages of text, the paper should include a title page, an abstract (up to 120 words), references, and any necessary tables, figures, or notes.
3. All papers should be masked. The only item not masked is the submission form.



## SUBMISSION PROCEDURES

1. Submit online at [www.psichi.org](http://www.psichi.org) under the AWARDS/GRANTS section. The link for submissions is available at least one month prior to the submission deadline.
2. Submissions are accepted online until midnight local time on February 1. Late entries will not be accepted.

## Previous APA Edwin B. Newman Graduate Research Award winner:

**Eric Hehman** | University of Delaware

*Where the Division Lies: Common Ingroup Identity Moderates the Cross-Race Recognition Effect*

This research explored how the salience of race or university group boundaries would affect recall of faces. Using a modified facial recognition paradigm, on each trial 8 Black and White faces were spatially organized either by race or university affiliation to induce categorization primarily based on one of these dimensions. When grouped by race, participants had superior recall for own-race faces and university affiliation had no effect. When grouped by university, participants had superior recall for own-university faces and race had no effect. Using identical stimuli across conditions, recall was superior for ingroup targets on the experimentally induced dimension of categorization, supportive of a social-categorization based explanation of the cross-race effect.
